## Downey Man Killed in County Crash

Orange County chalked up its third traffic fatality of the year this week with the death of Fred Tye, 64, of Downey, who died in Santa Ana Community hospital as the result of crash injuries.

The accident occurred Tuesday when the couple was enroute home from San Diego.

Mrs. Tye, 55, who received major injuries in the crash, told officers her husband was driving at 40 miles per hour when the car slipped out of control on the unbanked approaches to the Aliso Creek bridge on Hwy. 101.

Although the third traffic fatality in two weeks, Mr. Tye's death raised the number of deaths so far this year to only 60 per cent of the fatalities totaled in the first three weeks of 1953.

## Kuchel Backs President on Farm Issues

Senator Thomas H. Kuchel (R-Calif.) has made the following statement regarding recommendations submitted by President Eisenhower to Congress, Jan. 11, for dealing with the nation's farm problems:

"The President's recommendations offer a sound basis for working out the nation's farm problems. Certainly it recognizes the need for a long-range program that can be depended upon by our farmers. It also takes into consideration some of the ridiculous situations brought about by the controls required under past programs.

"An illustration is the plight of the cotton farmer in California. Present acreage allotment and marketing quota provisions for cotton call for about a 50 per cent cut in acreage from 1953. Even if Congress authorizes an increase in the cotton acreage allotment, California farmers will still have to cut back by about a third.

"Now farmers have heavy investments in their land and equip-

## Full Support Urged for New Hospital

A statement issued by Edward S. Hawkins, chairman of the Anaheim St. Jude Hospital Building Fund Committee, stressed the point that the proposed 100 bed Class A hospital cannot be built without the full support of each community involved in the drive.

"Unless each of seven communities bears its fair share of the load the project is in jeopardy," the statement said. "Let's not make the mistake of assuming that St. Jude's of Sunny Hills is ours for the asking, or by the grace of other people's efforts and money. While it's true that some very generous corporate and individual gifts have been received by the fund from Anaheim, Brea, Buena Park, Fullerton, La Habra, Placentia and Yorba Linda, money from these quarters is not enough to build the hospital.

"More than \$300,000 has been received from this phase of the campaign and more is expected. But we still need \$285,000 from the individual community drives now underway. The hospital will materialize only if each of us and all of us... business and individuals... wherever we are, step up to our responsibilities in this matter. There can be no 'free riders!'"

The statement continued, "Each community in North Orange county will benefit by construction of St. Jude's and each community has accepted a quota—over and above the 'big gifts' of individuals and corporations. These quotas are:

Anaheim \$20,000  
Brea 60,000  
Buena Park 50,000  
Fullerton 125,000  
La Habra 10,000  
Placentia 10,000  
Yorba Linda 10,000

"The total of these quotas, \$285,000 will build a \$2,000,000 hospital, assuming that the 'big gifts' push the grand total for the campaign to \$750,000. It works this way: \$750,000 from the current campaign plus \$750,000 of Orange, who will also operate the hospital without personal recompense and on a non-profit basis—plus \$500,000 from government funds adds up to \$2,000,000."

# Council Moves to Assess Subdividers \$25 per Lot for Park and Recreation Facilities

The Anaheim City Council moved yesterday to assess tract builders \$25 per lot for the cost of acquiring park and recreational facilities adjacent to school sites and the improvement of such areas.

Announcement of the council decision was made by the City Planning Commission which has been struggling with the problem of school sites in this fast-growing community where large tracts bring hundreds of youngsters into a neighborhood almost overnight.

The council action states that the assessment on each lot must be paid to the city before tract maps will receive final approval.

The move apparently is the outgrowth of a planning commission meeting where approval of maps for two tracts containing a total of 684 homes was held up because the number of new homes would bring approximately 750 elementary age children into the area, necessitating the addition of a school and a half to existing facilities.

Burden to School

Commissioner Mel Gauer said he thought the bringing of that many youngsters would seriously overburden Katelyn School.

One tract, to contain 375 homes, is bounded by Ball Rd. on the north, the Southern Pacific tracks on the east, Cerritos Ave. on the south and a point halfway between Euclid Ave. and the railroad tracks on the west.

The other tract, to contain 309 lots, is bounded by Ball Rd., Walnut St., the Southern Pacific tracks and Cerritos Ave.

Both tracts are owned by Elmer E. Everett, Whittier subdivider.

Planners ruled yesterday that Everett will be given approval on his maps if he pays the \$25 assessment per lot, notifies the school board in regard to the location of a school in the subdivision and will receive a notice from the school board after the Feb. 5 meeting specifying if the board wants a school in the tract.

Planners indicated the school board will work with city officials in handling the school problem for new tracts. Trustees will get a copy of all tract maps and decide if it is necessary to have a school on the tract or adjacent territory.

When the measure receives final passage, Anaheim will be the first Orange county community to pass such a law, city officials said yesterday.

## MWD Expansion Plans Launched

Record use of Colorado River water in Southern California this year was foreseen as a certainty today, whether the season's rainfall is above or below normal.

Robert B. Diemer, general manager and chief engineer of the Metropolitan Water District, said the 457-mile aqueduct system operated by the district carried an average of almost 200,000,000 gallons of water daily last year but that engineering studies point to an even higher demand in 1954.

To meet this area's growing dependence upon Colorado River water the District has under way a \$32,000,000 construction program, Diemer said. Municipal and other public water works also are carrying on expansion programs of their own, he added.

While the November distribution was \$1,560,336 lower than October, it was up \$5,054,448 over the same period last year. This \$1.23 per cent increase over November 1952 is primarily due to the increase in the tax rate on gasoline to 6c per gallon.

Mr. D. S. Quinn is planting an extensive orchard on his farm near Anaheim.

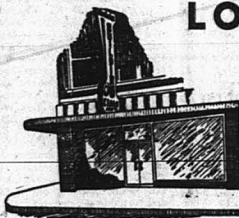

**Deadline Set for Farm Reports**

January 31, 1954, is the final date for farmers to file reports of performance on practices carried out under the 1953 Agricultural Conservation Program. Any report of performance that is not received in the county office or postmarked on or before January 31, 1954, cannot be considered in making 1953 payments.

A report of performance is a statement showing the conservation practice carried out and the extent, such as, number of acres, linear feet, cable yards, etc. There is an official form for this purpose, and it is the form on which the farmer was notified of his approval.

Of interest to all Orange County musicians is the announcement of a music workshop to be held Saturday, Jan. 23 at the Anaheim First Presbyterian Church. Featured speaker will be Dr. Lara Hoggard, former head conductor for the Fred Waring Pennsylvanians for 8 years. He will speak on latest conducting techniques.

He will bring with him a vast experience in teaching and conducting both choral and instrumental music. In his brilliant career so far he has lectured in over 60 colleges and universities, conducted workshops and music clinics nearly all 48 states and Canada and is in constant demand by colleges and universities all over the country as lecturer and conductor alike. Probably his greatest influence on music in the United States today was his position as dean of the Fred Waring Workshops which held sessions over the entire county.

The Orange County Chapter of the California Choral Conductors Guild is sponsoring the workshop which is open to all interested musicians whether they are members of the Guild or not. Those who will attend the Choral Workshop are asked to send dinner reservations for \$1.25 to the Anaheim Presbyterian Church. **Work Outlook For Coming Year**

Total employment in California this year will be about the same as in 1953, according to Willis Burlett, state employment director.

However, there will be a continued growth in population as in labor force which will mean more people seeking work, he said to the Personnel Management Association at Hotel San Diego.

"There have been many 'scare stories and rumors lately regarding unemployment but figures clearly show that there will be only a 1.8 percent increase in unemployment this year compared last year and that unemployment in California in 1954 still will be less than in 1949," the employment director said.

By March, which he said is generally regarded as the peak season for unemployment, he estimated there will be a total of 325,000 unemployed in California. This compares with a total of 220,000 in 1953 and 531,000 in 1949, he added.

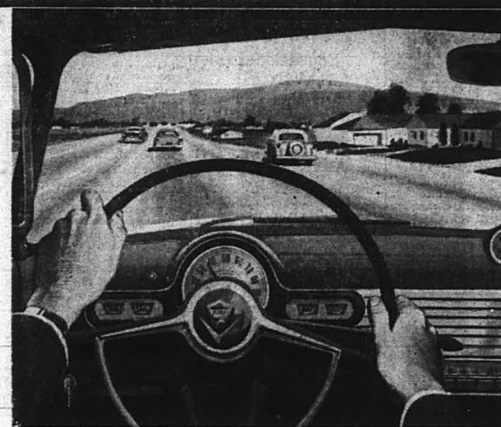
